

Feedlot Worker

- Take dust control measures on roadways, cattle lanes/alleys, livestock handling and feed preparation areas
- Prepare feed and water for animals
- Manage safety, speed, noise and dust of vehicle movements and machinery operations
- Record incoming and outgoing livestock movements
- Record animal and administer health treatment
- Record all internal movements from pen to pen, lot to lot, paddock to pen, pen to paddock



Feedlot manager

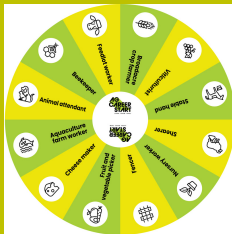
- Responsible for operational decision making
- Stock and commodity management and storage
- Record keeping and analysis for benchmarking and performance evaluation
- Develop business plans, budgets and production schedules

Animal nutritionist

- Research and advise on raw material product selection, maintenance feeding programs and modification of diets for animal production.
